	Step 1 I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:  18 years or older; Resident of New Mexico or employed in the state; I am able to read and write English; I have not been convicted of a felony or crime involving fraud, dishonesty, or deceit in the last five years; I have not had a notary public commission denied, suspended, or revoked in another state.
	Step 2 I purchased my state-required Notary bond, journal, seal, and supplies at <a href="www.NationalNotary.org/NM/Renew">www.NationalNotary.org/NM/Renew</a> or I called 1-800-876-6827.
	Step 3 I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).
	Step 4 I have contacted the NNA at 1-800-876-6827 if I did not provide my county at the time of my purchase. (This information is required to execute my bond.)
	Step 5  If my commission has been expired for more than one year, I have completed the training and exam.
<b>_</b>	Step 6 Within 2 business days, the NNA has emailed my bond.
	Step 7
	I have completed my <u>Notary commission application</u> online and submitted it with the application fee and certificate of completion of the course and exam.
	Step 8
<b>_</b>	Once approved, the state will issue the Certificate of Commission or Notice of Approval. I have emailed a copy of one of these documents to <a href="mailto:releasing@nationalnotary.org">releasing@nationalnotary.org</a> or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my document has been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.
	Step 9 Within 45 days of my application being approved, I have provided proof of my Notary stamp by sending in the stamp registration form.
